

PROFESSIONAL ELECTIVES

PharmD students must complete a minimum of 6 hours of program electives prior to graduation (Class of 2018 and 2019). PharmD students, class of 2020 and forward must complete 9 hours of program elective prior to graduation. Elective course work is to be taken while enrolled in the Doctor of Pharmacy program. We cannot count any courses taken prior to matriculation into the PharmD program.
