In 2016, Ohio State's first-time test takers exceeded the average annual pass rate for Ohio institutions and ACPE-accredited programs on both the NAPLEX (Ohio institutions' average: 91.44%, national average: 85.86%) and the Multistate Pharmacy Jurisprudence Exam (Ohio institutions' average: 96.67%, national average: 84.74%).³

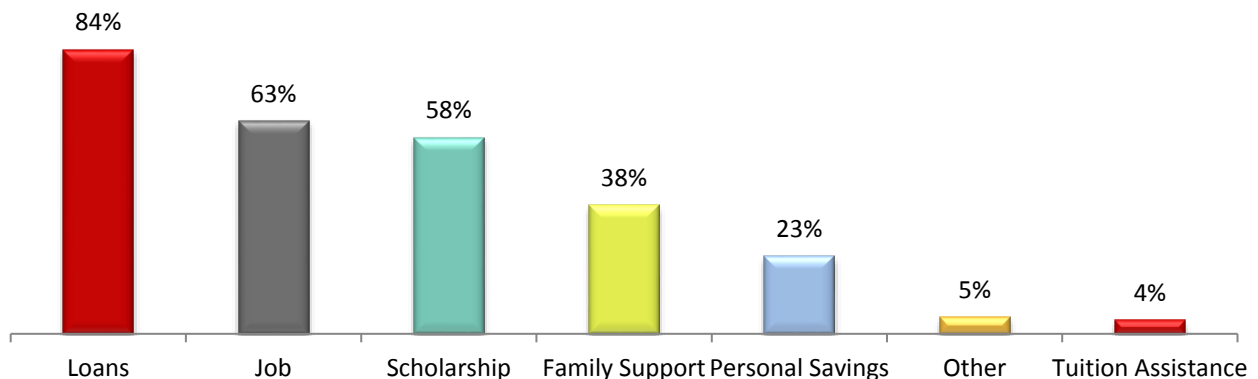

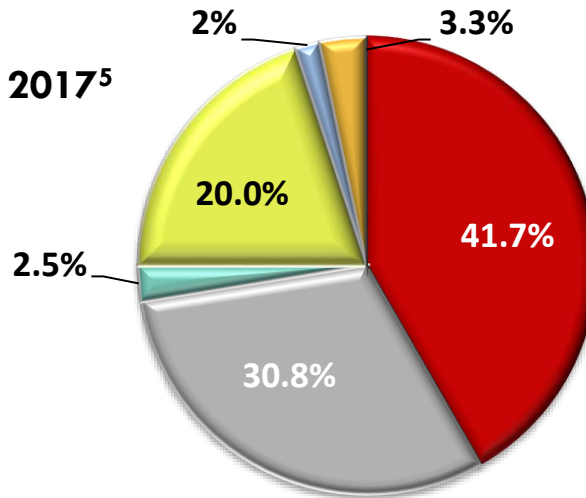

How Did Students Pay for Pharmacy School?⁵

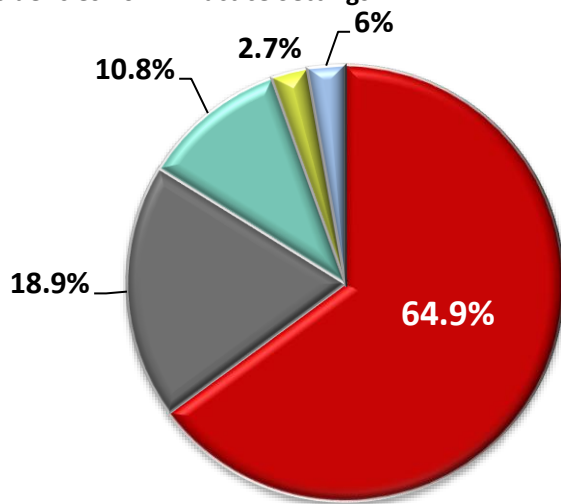


Post-Graduation Outcomes, May 2017⁵

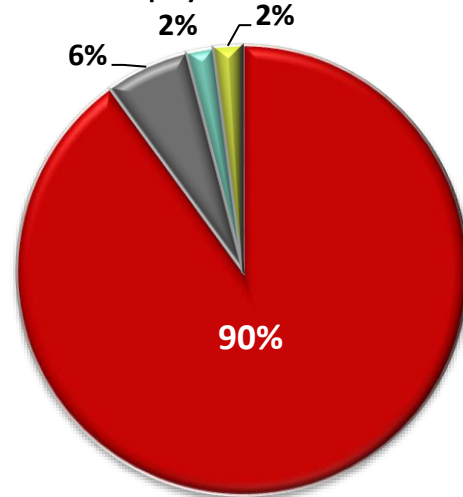


Residencies 2017: Practice Settings

- ¹Four-year graduation rate reflects percentage of students from cohort admitted four years prior to graduation, minus students who pursue dual degrees requiring them to extend their enrollment time in the PharmD program beyond four years. Percentages of students delaying graduation for other reasons, withdrawing or dismissed from program calculated based on number of non-dual-degree graduates from the cohort admitted four years prior.

- ³Ohio colleges/schools of pharmacy used in the Ohio institutions' average (weighted average) include Cedarville University, Northeast Ohio University College of Medicine, Ohio Northern University, the University of Cincinnati, the University of Findlay and the University of Toledo.
- ⁴Pharmacy 7007: Capstone includes 20 graded assessments linked to competencies necessary for success in experiential rotations. Students are required to pass at least 15 activities to be eligible to begin advanced practice experience rotations.
- ⁵Data obtained from OSU College of Pharmacy Doctor of Pharmacy Placement Survey of the Class of 2017, conducted in April 14-May 1, 2017. Of 120 OSU College of Pharmacy graduating students, 120 returned completed surveys (100% response rate). Due to the nature of the survey, individuals were only required to answer the questions that applied to them, leading to a varying number of responses for each item.
