Admissions Process

Below is a brief timeline outlining the college's fluid admissions process.



Prerequisites

A completed US bachelor's degree (or the equivalent) is required. Additionally, students must complete the following prerequisites courses with a grade of C- or higher:

- Biology (1 class/lab)
- General Chemistry (2 classes/2 labs)
- Organic Chemistry (2 classes/1 lab)
- Microbiology (1 class/lab)
- Biochemistry (1 class)
- Precalculus (1 class)
- Statistics (1 class)
- Human Physiology (1 class)

*(Your degree **must** be completed by the time of the program start)*



Campus Visit

We encourage all interested applicants to schedule a time to come visit and tour our college campus. Tours will also be offered as a part of the in-person interview day experience.

Once your PharmCAS application is verified, you will receive the Ohio State supplemental application.



Interview Day

After reviewing full applications, our admissions committee will invite selected applicants to schedule an interview.

The interview experience gives candidates the opportunity to learn more about our program as well as engage with current students, faculty and staff.

Priority Deadline

If you'd like to receive priority consideration for an interview invitation and scholarships, be sure to submit your PharmCAS application and supplemental application by the priority deadline of November 1. **This option is non-binding and is best suited for candidates for whom Ohio State is their top choice.**

Requirements

Admissions Requirements

- A grade of C- or higher is required for **all** prerequisite courses
- A minimum 2.7 cumulative GPA is required to be considered for admission
- A completed US bachelor's degree or the equivalent is required by time of matriculation

Prerequisite Requirements

- A grade of C- or higher is required for **all** prerequisite courses
- Introductory Biology with a lab (3 hrs)
- General Chemistry with labs (10 hrs)
- Organic Chemistry with a lab (7 hrs)
- Precalculus (4 hrs)
- Microbiology with a lab (4 hrs)
- Statistics (3 hrs)
- Biochemistry (3 hrs)
- Human Physiology (3 hrs)

Online Application

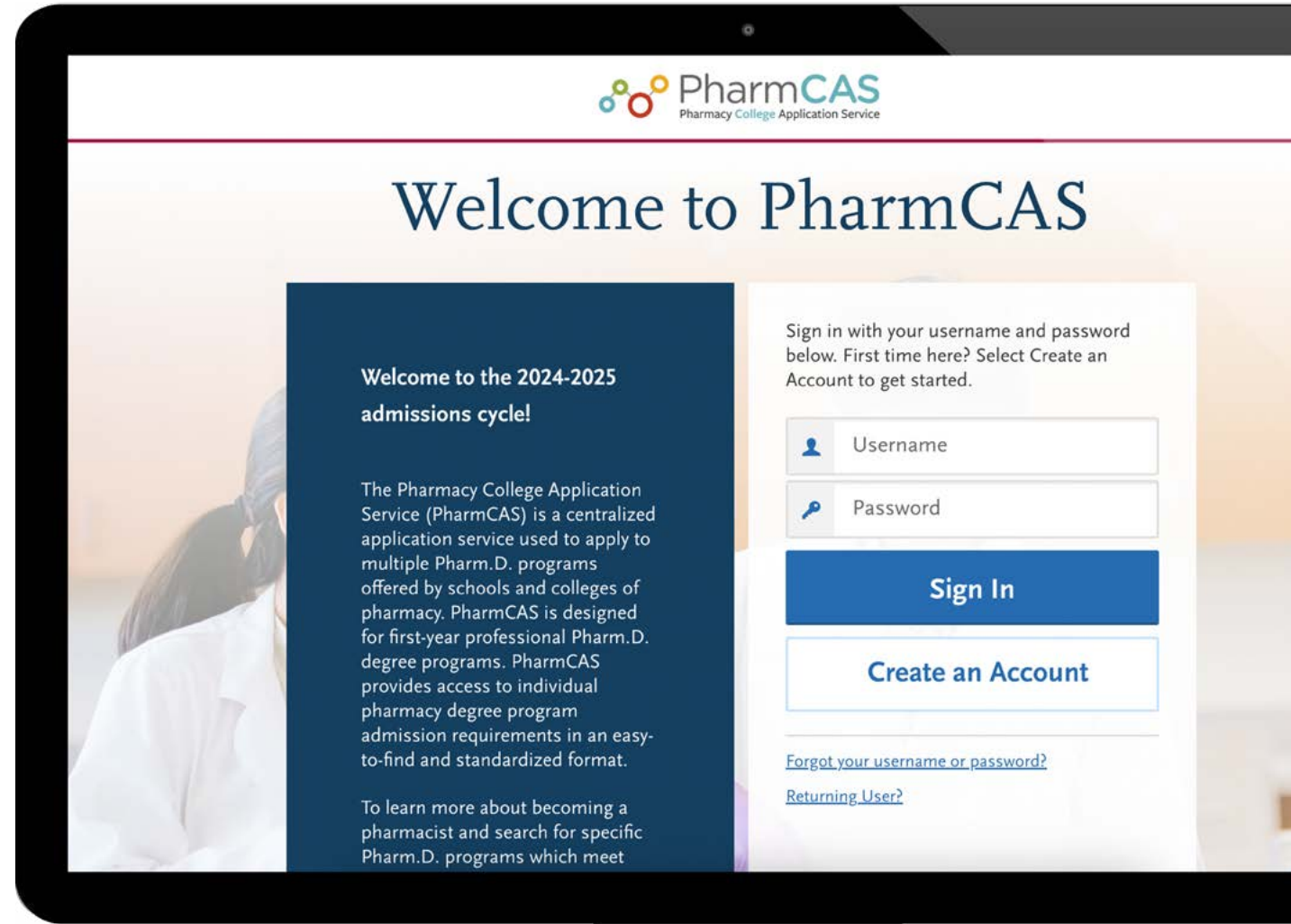
01 PharmCAS Application

The first step in the application process is to complete and submit an online application to PharmCAS. To be considered by the priority deadline, your PharmCAS application must be submitted by November 1. Otherwise, ***your PharmCAS application must be submitted by the final application deadline of March 2, 2026.*** We encourage you to apply as early as possible. You must submit your PharmCAS application before starting your supplemental application.

The PharmCAS application includes the following:

1. PharmCAS application fee
2. Biographical data
3. Postsecondary institutions attended
4. Academic course history
5. Work experience
6. Extracurricular activities
7. A personal statement
8. Three letters of recommendation
9. Official transcripts from all accredited U.S. institutions attended

We recommend that you have unofficial copies of all postsecondary transcripts available before you begin this process.



02 Supplemental Application

After completing the PharmCAS application, you will be sent The Ohio State University supplemental application. **It will be sent to the email address that you applied with.**

Interview Days

All interviews are offered both virtually and in-person.

Candidates have the option to choose an in-person or virtual interview. Zoom interviews are more accessible for students with limited resources to travel to the Ohio State campus. In-person interviews will include an added tour of the College of Pharmacy.

The interview day will give you a chance to learn more about what makes our PharmD program unique. It will also offer you the opportunity to get your questions answered and see if Ohio State is the best fit for you. Students will interact with program staff, faculty and current PharmD students throughout the process.

Interviews typically occur September through March.

Tuition

Non-Resident Surcharge (First Year Only)

Students who are not considered residents of the state of Ohio are charged a Non-Resident Tuition Surcharge during their first year; during years 2-4, the charge is instead \$5 per term. If you want to gain residency for tuition purposes during your first year or years 2-4 for other purposes, please work with our [residency office](#).



Scholarships

Prospective students may apply for College of Pharmacy scholarships through [ScholarshipUniverse](#), Ohio State's scholarship-matching tool. External OSU scholarships are also available in ScholarshipUniverse, and these scholarships vary in amount. ScholarshipUniverse opens December 1 of each year and the final deadline to apply for these scholarships is February 15th of each year. Scholarships will be awarded in late February.



Federal Financial Aid

You may complete the FAFSA application as soon as it becomes available for the year you wish to enter. You are not required to have an admission decision before completing this application. The priority deadline is March 1 of the year you wish to enroll.

5 Application Tips

From Current Student Ambassadors

“Formulate & draft your answers to common interview questions (Why are you interested in pharmacy? What are your strengths?

Describe a time when you overcame adversity, etc.) and practice interviewing with your friends.”

“Make sure when you’re writing your personal statement to show and not just tell. Adding stories whenever possible to illustrate who you are as an applicant is important!”

“Start as early as you can on your application, so you are not overwhelmed.

Work on it a little bit each day!”

“[When preparing for an interview] make sure you are able to talk about everything that is on your resume, what you liked or disliked about the experience, and what you learned or how you grew from the experience.”

“Take the time when you’re finished writing [your essay] to proofread everything! By taking a few minutes to review what you wrote, you can improve the quality of your writing and communicate your thoughts more clearly.”
