MS HSPAL Celebrates 65 Years at ASHP Midyear

While cruising along the Mississippi River on a riverboat in the heart of New Orleans, 120 alumni, students, faculty and staff of The Ohio State University College of Pharmacy MS in Health-System Pharmacy Administration and Leadership (MS HSPAL) program celebrated its 65th anniversary.

The milestone celebration was held on Dec. 8 in conjunction with the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists (ASHP) Midyear Clinical Meeting and Exhibition, which draws faculty, staff, students, residents and alumni from The Ohio State University College of Pharmacy and other programs every December.

Past and current members of the MS HSPAL degree program also belong to the Latiolais Leadership Program (LLP), which was established by Clifton J. Latiolais to inspire a culture of support and comradery among students, residents and alumni of the program. All MS HSPAL students are invited to participate in LLP, which grants them lifetime access to events for networking and mentorship. The program currently includes over 400 alumni. Ohio State has been a leader in health-system pharmacy administration and leadership largely because of Latiolais, who brought international distinction to The Ohio State University Hospitals and the College of Pharmacy since his career at Ohio State began in 1958. For the next quarter century, Latiolais would publish widely adopted textbooks and teach and operate under a philosophy he coined, "Enthusiasm for Excellence."

This fund was created with a clear purpose: to enhance opportunities for pharmacy residents at Ohio State by supporting experiences that go beyond traditional residency training. Through this endowment, Jake Thompson, MS '10, a proud Buckeye, accomplished pharmacy leader and passionate advocate for advancing the profession, is giving back to the program that helped shape his career and his family.

Jake's connection to Ohio State runs deep. He met his wife, Kristen, during his pharmacy residency—she herself a Buckeye through and through, having completed both medical school and orthopedic residency at Ohio State. Now living in Oregon, they are raising their children as dedicated Buckeye fans, with their home filled with Ohio State memorabilia and their son already dreaming of playing soccer at Ohio State.

For Jake and Kristen, giving back is a family value. They are drawn to philanthropic efforts where they can see tangible impact – supporting programs that shaped their own journeys and demonstrating to their children what it means to invest in something meaningful. Residency is a time of learning—but also financial strain. Jake vividly remembers living paycheck to paycheck as a resident. The fund aims to ease that burden by supporting opportunities that aren't typically covered by residency programs. Whether it's travel to shadow a pediatric expert across the country, attend a specialized conference or participate in advanced training for AI or analytics, this fund will make it possible.

The vision for the Jake Thompson Endowed Residency Fund is simple: eliminate barriers and create access to non-traditional, high-impact experiences that expand residents' professional development and reinforce the Buckeye presence in every corner of pharmacy practice.

"This isn't just about travel or training," Jake shared. "It's about broadening horizons—helping residents chase passions, build connections and grow in ways that make them more confident and capable leaders. I can't wait to see how our residents use this support to push our profession forward and continue building the Buckeye brand across the country."



Jake's call to action is one we can all answer. Alumni and friends of the program are encouraged to support the program—whether through mentorship, financial contributions or simply helping connect the next generation of Buckeye pharmacists to the broader community. Together, we can ensure that our residents have the tools, access and inspiration they need to thrive.
